## Weekly Progress (6 - 12 April)



We have now given a total of 400,473 vaccines (a combination of 1st and 2nd doses) across our Health Board area. This week we started vaccinating those aged 40-49, and by the end of next week, everyone within this age group should have received their appointment letter.

Vaccines are the best way to protect people from COVID-19 and have already saved thousands of lives. Vaccination is highly effective and substantially reduces the risk of infection and severe Covid-19 disease. Everyone should continue to get their vaccination when asked to do so unless specifically advised otherwise.

For those aged 29 years and under who are not in a clinical risk group, the JCVI has amended their guidance which now states that this cohort should be offered an alternative to the AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine, if available.

#### 1000 Immunisers



Since beginning in December 2020, over 1000 immunisers have received training in the Mass Vaccination Centres. Initially, these were Health Board staff who were redeployed or had volunteered to vaccinate in addition to their contracted hours. The new recruits began to filter into the programme at Christmas, shortly followed by the military personnel. Legislative changes then enabled

vaccinators to participate from a much wider professional background. The staff groups included Nurses, Midwives and Health Visitors, Physiotherapists, Pharmacists, Doctors, Dentists, Dental Hygienists, Health Care Support Workers, Student nurses and many others including retired staff.

The immunisation team initiated the training programme and were subsequently supported by workforce to develop an enthusiastic and competent team of trainers. Their ethos was to foster a warm and welcoming supportive environment for all staff. The training team is extremely proud of what has been achieved in a short period of time, it has been so rewarding knowing that they have played a crucial role in delivering the high quality vaccination programme.

## **Vaccinations during Ramadan**
